



Kindergarten walkers may enter doors 1, 3, or 5.

Kindergarten walkers will be dismissed from door 4 and must be met by an adult.

Kiss and Ride

Our Kiss and Ride loop is in the parking lot off of Powells Tavern. The longest wait will be before doors open and the bell. Please be patient and remain in your car. A staff member will come to your car, call for your child, and your child will enter from the passenger side at the loading zone near the playground.

Students eligible to ride a bus will be assigned a bus. Staps and times will be in SIS ParentVUE a few days before school begins.

Bus

Kindergarteners will have yellow tape place on their backpacks to identify them to the bus driver. They will sit in the front of the bus and MUST be met by an adult.

SACC provides fun, safe and educational care for children in kindergarten-sixth grade before school, after school and during school vacations in most Fairfax County public elementary schools. Children with special needs are fully included in all SACC centers.

The SACC program serves children five days a week, Monday-Friday.

Before School - 7 a.m. until school begins.

After School - End of school day until 6:15 p.m. SACC service begins when the children are dismissed from school.

Winter/Spring/Summer Programs - Full-day winter, spring and summer programs are offered at several consolidated sites throughout the

Children will explore the lives of animals through biomes Bismes are collections of the plants and animals living in a specific environment type. There are five biomes to explore: Aquatic, Grassland, Forest, Desert and Tundra. By exploring the environments they live in, the people they are near, and the way they live their lives, we can begin to understand the world of animals.

Making Tracks

Throughout the school year we will immerse ourselves into diverse environments and discover all that they have to offer, from wild terrains and weather to flora and fauna. We will move through the school year using "tracks," An animal track is an impoint left behind in the soil, snow, med or another ground surface by an animal walking or slithering over it. 
