Language Arts



- \star Build oral communication skills

Mathematics



Transportation

Walkers

Kindergarten walkers may enter doors 1, 3, or 5.

Kindergarten walkers will be dismissed from door 4 and must be met by an adult.

Kiss and Ride

Our Kiss and Ride loop is in the parking lot off of Powells Tavern. The longest wait will be before doors open and the bell. Please be patient and remain in your car. A staff member will come to your car, call for your child, and your child will enter from the passenger side at the loading zone near the playground.

Bus

Students eligible to ride a bus will be assigned a bus. Stops and times will be in SIS ParentVUE a few days before school begins.


Kindergarteners will have yellow tape place on their backpacks to identify them to the bus driver. They will sit in the front of the bus and MUST be met by an adult.




